1 THE DEPUTY CLERK: Criminal Trial 07-0356X,
2 State of Maryland versus Myles Spires, Junior.

3 MR. BRENNAN: Good morning, Your Honor.
4 William Brennan on behalf of the Defendant, Myles
5 Spires. Mr. Spires is seated to my left, Your Honor.

6 MR. TROSTLE: Good morning, Your Honor. Steve
7 Trostle, Assistant State Prosecutor, Office of the State
8 Prosecutor, on behalf of the State.

9 THE COURT: The Court has rescheduled this
10 matter today to determine whether the Defendant was
11 eligible, or is eligible for electronic monitoring. And
12 I have received a memorandum from Kenneth Gray, who is
13 in charge of the Home Monitoring Services over at the
14 Detention Center, indicating that he is, in fact,
15 eligible, and that they have a space for him. Based
16 upon that, the Court is considering, or reconsidering
17 its disposition. Does the State wish to be heard?

18 MR. TROSTLE: The State is generally opposed.
19 Otherwise, the State does defer to Your Honor.

20 THE COURT: Very well. Defense.

21 MR. BRENNAN: We are in favor of moving Mr.
22 Spires, Your Honor, from the Detention Center to the
23 Home Monitoring Program.

24 THE COURT: Does your client wish to be heard?

25 MR. BRENNAN: No, Your Honor.

1 THE COURT: Very well. And I'm doing this
2 based upon the Defendant's lack of record. He has now
3 served some time in the County Detention Center. And I
4 really want him to be about the business of making
5 restitution to the jurisdiction and establishing that he
6 can comply with the requirements of the law.

7 So, the sentence will be now, it will still be
8 six months, but that six months will be served on home
9 detention.

10 Sir, if you violate the terms of the home
11 detention, I have no problem giving you a straight
12 sentence. So make sure that you're in compliance, you
13 understand their rules and regulations, and that there
14 are no problems. Mr. Gray will call me 24 hours a day.

15 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, ma'am.

16 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you very much.

17 MR. TROSTLE: Thank you, Your Honor.

18 MR. BRENNAN: Thank you, Your Honor.
