TRASH COLLECTION

TRASH IS TO BE PLACED OUT THE NIGHT BEFORE COLLECTION

PICK-UP DAYS BEGIN AT 6:30 a.m.

MONDAY—*Recycle & Trash*

WEDNESDAY—*Yard Waste (April 15-Jan. 15)*

THURSDAY—*Bulk & Trash*

Trash consist of all mixed combustibles and non-combustibles including garbage, household trash, paper, rags, and cardboard. Trash should be placed within two feet of the curb line.

The County collects recyclable materials in the Town on **MONDAY** (plastics, newspapers, etc.)

Whenever Prince George's County Government holidays are celebrated on a Mon. Weds. or Thurs., trash will not be picked up on those days, nor will there be a make up date. However, trash will be picked up on the next regular scheduled pick-up date. Your cooperation with Town Ordinances for disposing of residential trash is important for maintaining health and property values in the Town.

YARD WASTE

Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, small branches and brush.

Yard waste must be placed in securely tied, heavy-duty paper or plastic bags, or heavy duty trash cans with handles and a secure lid. Limbs must not exceed four (4) feet in length and (3) inches in diameter and must be securely tied in bundles. Bundles of limbs and bags of dry grass and leaves must weigh less than 60

pounds and leaves must weigh less than 25 pounds.

Public Works will charge residents a \$50 minimum clean-up fee for leaves raked into the street or gutters. This act is also subject to a citation from the Code Enforcement Officer.

Propane Tank Pick-ups are \$30 each. Please call the Town Hall.

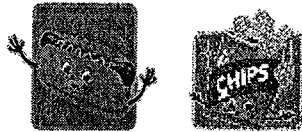

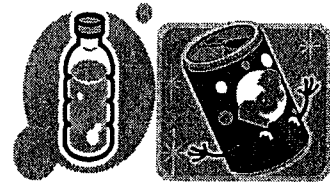

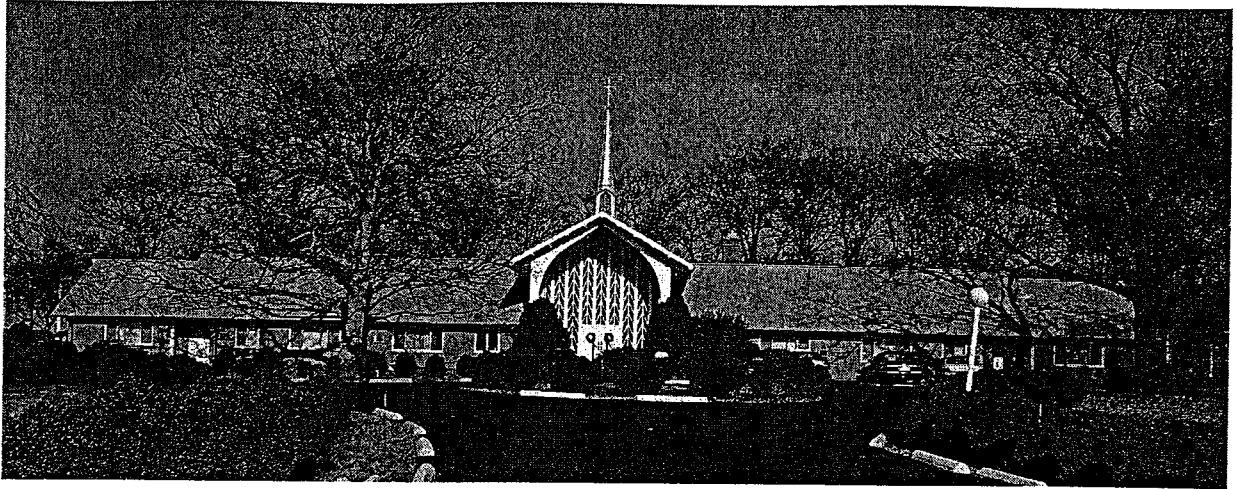
